Stuart Hellmintoller's Surf Burger

hile browsing on Facebook, I came across a fly I felt was worth keeping in a pocket when I head out to fish the surf. The fly's designed by Stuart Hellmintoller and it's called the Surf Burger. It has the makings of everything I like in a surf fly; the orange/red colors, the marabou tail with a bit of sparkle in it, a weighted head, and a chenille body. In addition, the weighted "cones" behind the eye give it the heft needed to get it down through the water column quickly. As a tier, I like the choice of cones over barbell eyes for a few reasons. They are easy to slip over



the hook, they won't rotate in the surf as barbell eyes tend to do, and they keep the eye of the hook clean from material, thread, and head cement.

This fly is very similar to Lee Baermann's Checkerboard pattern, a popular surf fly along the coast. But I believe Lee uses barbell eyes in his pattern, and the bodies on his flies are often tied in a red and black or a two-toned orange chenille to form a checkerboard design.

After a little back-and-forth of emailing Johnathan, I suggested the Surf Burger as a pattern worth sharing with the Club tying group. He asked if I had field-tested it—and I had. Although I haven't caught many perch on it yet, I attribute that to the water conditions, the scarcity of perch where I was fishing—and to the fact that it just might be the guy fishing it. The bottom line is—the problem's not with the fly.

As the water warms following the recent rains and the perch and corbina return in numbers to the surf zone, it strikes me as a good time to replenish our fly boxes and add a new pattern as well.

Here's the pattern, with my spin on it, that I sent in an email to Jonathan:

The materials I use: Size 6 saltwater hook (I like Gamakatsu hooks), Spirit River Hot Cones 3/16, Uni BigFly orange



thread (I'm a big fan of this thread for tying surf flies), orange or red Marabou with about ten strands of Flashabou or Crystal Flash mixed with it, and a body of variegated chenille. I'm experimenting with the chenille colors. The one I saw on Facebook had a dark variegated body, but again, I lean towards the reds and oranges. Play around with body colors here.

I hope to see you in the surf!


